

Greetings from sunny Shenley! (well it's sunny as I write this!)

There's been nothing much ordinary about Ordinary Time this year at St Martin's. I think I was secretly hoping for a little lull after Easter this year, but the Almighty had other plans and who am I to argue?! As always, there's been a flurry of activity at St Martin's and all joking aside it's been incredibly encouraging.

.....and much has been taking place in these areas.

In terms of Youth Ministry, our fortnightly Youth Group is expanding, from September we will have 14 members (all secondary school aged). We meet and share faith experiences, do a bit of Bible study and this year we've also enjoyed and have arranged a number of 'field trip' activities too, including; dog agility, tour of Watford FC stadium, exploring the Apple Orchard, a tour of the Arsenal training ground and we're also looking forward to visiting the wonderful church in Aldenham to look around the bell tower and enjoy a private viewing of the art work in September. Bishop Jane came along to one of our sessions in May and the Youth Group entirely led and created a Sunday morning service in July, complete with sermon! (see photo).

In terms of 'Deepening Faith' our weekly House Group has been hugely valuable, however, after listening to feedback we've decided to explore another route and hopefully introduce a monthly worship & discussion session on a Sunday evening which aims to delve deeper into some of the hot topics we battle with (watch this space for details!).

'Community Reaching' is ongoing, on D-Day we joined the local community at the War Memorial where the Youth Group shared poetry and we also attended the D-Day community celebration in Shenley Park, with live music and picnics. The St Martin's cake stall at the Shenley Summer Fete was also a huge success (see photo), despite the rain and we plan to have our yearly Church Quiz in October too.

On September 6th we're introducing a weekly 'Community Café', essentially a good old fashioned 'coffee morning', it will run from 9.30-11am every Friday (except on the days when we have Soup Lunch – which is the last Friday of the month). We've already had tea/coffee/hot chocolate donated from the 'Café in the Orchard' and we're hoping this will offer a space for all those wanting to meet new people and enjoying the space in church.

As well as these three areas, our church finances continue to be a challenge, however we're heading in the right direction with more people signing up to the Parish Giving scheme and through the introduction of our new contactless card reader that is collecting donations from our visitors.

There's lots more going on, but hopefully this gives you a flavour of what's been happening recently. I personally, as always, look forward to leading worship at both the Aldenham and Radlett churches and hope to see you all again soon.

FROM RADLETT

 \Rightarrow

We continue to focus on the three key areas in our Mission Action Plan: young people, deepening discipleship, and ministry among the elderly.



In addition to Childrens' Church, our new Youth Group meets after church on the field for sports, refreshments, conversation, and prayer. This group offers a space for teenagers to share their experiences and hopes/fears/dreams and to commit these to prayer in a safe space. They have taken responsibility for planning for the coming months, and it is a good reminder for Rev'd. Ollie about humility, as he is not as good at football as he remembers!

A new Youth Club will begin meeting regularly at St. John's Church on Friday evenings from the end of September. This group is supported by the Phab charity and is deliberately crafted for disabled and non-disabled children to enjoy together.

We have seen an increase in baptisms lately and have enjoyed offering this sacrament within the 'main' 10.30 am Sunday service, welcoming families and getting to know them over refreshments afterwards. This makes for a very lively atmosphere. Sunday Fun Day and All Together Worship (our monthly contemporary offerings) are still going strong with lovely friendships building between the generations and families. On 12 August we hosted this year's Summer Event from Aldenham Parish Council which was very well attended, with bouncy castles, bungee trampolines, a petting zoo, face-painting and considerable amounts of candy floss.

Later in August Rev'd. Ollie will attend Camp Unity, an interfaith summer camp for children from the local area, held in Borehamwood. He is due to perform songs and stories with Hare Krishna and Jewish friends as part of our interfaith outreach.

We have formed a new Pastoral Care Team meeting monthly to ensure all members of our churches are well cared for and that no one is 'left behind' in any sense. Training is being provided alongside the meetings from a theological and reflective practice perspective, with prayer and the 'call to serve' at the heart of this ministry.

We have formed a partnership with Radlett Reform Synagogue and Home Instead to develop a new Memory Café for those suffering with memory loss and their loved ones and carers. This has proved to be very popular and the fortnightly sessions are very busy. The Rabbi and the Priest together led the singing at a recent session, and make no apology for it!

As part of Churches Together in July we enjoyed a pilgrimage to Canterbury Cathedral followed a week later by a shared picnic on Church Field which was very well attended. A short service of worship was held during the picnic to refresh our commitment to serving one another and the wider community.

Sadly on 8 August we lost Rev'd. Canon Christopher Newton who has been a much loved and stalwart member of this church and community, not least as its Vicar from 1958 – 1966. Christopher had celebrated his 99th birthday just two weeks prior.

Following the riots and disorder across England and Northern Ireland we recommitted to reach out and support one another. Our Inclusivity Alliance group are preparing further events designed to assist with cohesion and mutual support in the community.

Our Bible study groups are still going strong, including the monthly 'Feast and Faith' group which is travelling around members' houses and enjoying a period of in-depth study on the Lord's Prayer. We also continue to offer a weekly study and prayer session via Zoom every Saturday morning.

We are looking forward to welcoming guest speakers in the coming months, including Bishop Jane, and Professor Anthony G. Reddie for Black History Month.

Rev'd. Ollie is helping the diocese to prepare a Year of Spiritual Renewal and Well-being in 2025, a programme of events including retreats, quiet days, and study sessions for everyone – clergy, lay ministers, and congregations. Look out for more on this later in the year from Bishop Alan. An official launch will follow with the Archbishop of Canterbury during his visit to the diocese in November.

WHO BUILT AND SET UP THE CROSS?

Not fiends incarnate, not vindictive men, just plain, ordinary men like me and you, kindly, decent souls who, no doubt, went home at the end of the day to their families, had tea as usual and played with the children before bedtime and slept well after a good day's work They were perhaps a little old fashioned in their thinking, had fixed, inelastic views, somewhat hostile to new ideas, - surely only a minor sin at worst. But there was one not so far away in his palace who had had a bad time of it, poor Pilate, had lost his temper with these impossible, infuriating Jews in days gone by and had received a

curt warning from the emperor that there should be no further bloodshed in Jerusalem and, horror of horrors, here was new trouble at the very worst time of the whole year, with these fanatics in their tens of thousands up for the Feast! Now here before him was the man who had lined the streets the day before with cheering crowds and was being asked to pass the death penalty on him by the chief priest and the elders with a very dubious case which amounted to little more than spite and envy supported by even shadier witnesses. He'd thought of a quick and easy way out of the dilemma, let the mob decide between him and that charlatan and criminal Barabbas. He would accept their choice. The ploy failed they chose Barabbas. His hand was forced.

But where were Jesus' many supporters? The ones he had healed, comforted, inspired, relieved of their burden of guilt and sin? Only a few relatives and close friends were there

when he died on the cross. None were there at the trial. No doubt they had other things on their minds in his hour of need. Perhaps had relatives or friends to see, messages to deliver? They felt sure he would be all right. They didn't need to worry about being there. They felt someone else other than them would be there. Minds which were selfish, lazy, irresponsible, minds full of worldly wisdom which excused their behaviour. Their indifference which did nothing at all brought about the shame of mankind and the great tragedy of history which time cannot erase.

The terrible thing is that they, all of them, are in your heart and mine. Perhaps that's because we have never really fully and determinedly committed ourselves to Jesus and the way of life he seeks for us but choose to judge ourselves leniently against nothing more than the standards of today and the ways and habits of those around us. Come to Jesus and see how sorry is your record and your desperate need for forgiveness and a new wholesome life.

It seems she also stars in wedding photos and couples specially ask for her to be included!



New home and retirement

It's now quite a while since we moved into our new home in Watford. A little bit longer since my last service and entering retirement. It seems much longer! There has been much to do with the move, so I haven't really had much time to really start relaxing.

The main difference though is not having the pressures and demands of day-to-day ministry. I certainly haven't missed that and it has freed up some 'headspace' for thinking about other areas of life.

The question that keeps coming back to me is how I really want to use this time of retirement. This is the question

that many people have asked me to which I have always replied - 'reading' and 'gardening.' So far though, I haven't done much of either! There are plenty of books waiting to be read and the garden is well stocked with plants and flowers, plus a couple of raised vegetable patches, which can be watched and admired for the time being. The first year is the time to see what's there and start planning for next.

Sunday mornings, sitting in a local church congregation at a service feels like a totally new experience, after all the years of leading from the front. There are two churches I have attended; one being very high church with incense and bells, to the other extreme

where the Vicar wears a suit for services. Oh, the contrasts of the church of England!

I would much prefer something in the middle like Aldenham!

At a deeper level though is the sense of not yet feeling part of a congregation. I don't yet feel part of any church. And this has brought home to me the importance of the fellowship and church community to which to belong. It is that part of us that needs to feel that we are part of a community of Christian believers. Without this it can seem like there is little real connection with Christ. The church is the 'body of Christ,' or the 'people of God.' I first came into or back to the church through the warmth and welcoming of a congregation at St. Devenick's church, Aberdeen many years ago. This formative experience of the Church has always been with me. And it's been with me throughout my ministry, with 24 years at Aldenham of course! I need to find it again here in Watford!
